We are looking to appoint one or more inspiring and enthusiastic Netball Coaches to support our high profile and extensive PE and Games department.

The successful candidate/s will have a proven record of coaching Netball to a high standard and help lead the development and delivery of our netball programme.

A positive approach to the development of school sport, the ability to work as part of a team, and a willingness to participate fully in a busy, successful independent school are essential.

This position will involve coaching up to five afternoons a week through the netball season. Given the nature of coaching, it is desirable for coaches to be available for weekend fixtures, but this is not a necessity.

Remuneration for Netball Coaches is £34 per hour.

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Job Description

Key Responsibilities

- Coach a Netball squad during the Spring and Summer terms to improve technique and performance
- Promote excellence in coaching and learning to ensure pupils develop their potential in Netball
- Ensure that individual pupil progress is regularly assessed, recorded and reported to the Head of Netball and used to inform future coaching
- Keep up to date with developments in Netball and to ensure that best practice is adopted
- Ensure that the school's Health and Safety policy is implemented in Netball, and ensure pupils are made aware of H&S within netball
- Ensure discipline and a positive environment is maintained during each coaching session, including promoting the values of fair play, teamwork, healthy competition and respect for rules and opposition
- Contribute to the positive promotion and reputation of netball at Leicester Grammar School and in the local and wider community
- Accompany teams to and from matches, umpire matches, ensure visiting teams/supporters are offered hospitality
- Ensure team kit and equipment is well cared for and, in consultation with the Head of Netball, that it meets Health & Safety standards
- Support and contribute to the school's responsibility for safeguarding pupils
- Lead and conduct oneself in an exemplary manner from a child protection point of view.

Additional Duties

- Work in accordance within current safeguarding and schools' guidance and legislation
- Use excellent organisational skills and interpersonal and communication skills to manage own workload and build relationships
- Monitor, review and evaluate events and strategies
- Be committed to the Leicester Grammar School Trust's vision and ethos



The person

Essential Qualifications, Experience and Skills

- England Netball Level 1 or Level 2 qualification
- A proven track record of success as a Netball coach
- Ability to umpire to a good standard
- Model and promote good manners and an understanding of the needs of pupils of all abilities
- Ability to build strong working relationships with pupils, other professionals and parents
- Ability to communicate effectively and appropriately with a range of audiences, such as pupils, colleagues and parents
- Excellent time management and organisational skills
- Ability to follow instructions, policies and procedures

Desirable Qualifications, Experience and Skills

- England Netball into officiating or C award Umpire
- Suitable coaching experience
- A first aid qualification or a willingness to undertake this
- A minibuss driver qualification would be an advantage, but is not essential
- Able to demonstrate and promote positive values, attitudes and behaviour with young people
- Understanding of safeguarding

Original certificates will be required as proof of qualification. All other attributes will be assessed using the contents of the application form, at interview and with professional references.

Personal Qualities

- Have an enthusiasm for your sport
- Willingness to work flexibly according to the fluctuating demands of the role, including occasional evenings and weekends, when required
- Ability to work as part of a team and collaboratively across the school
- Excellent interpersonal skills

Above all, the successful candidate will have an infectious enthusiasm for the value and relevance of netball and sport in young people's lives.



The School

In 2024 Leicester Grammar School was recognised as East Midlands Independent Secondary School as well as East Midlands School of the Year for Academic Performance by the Sunday Times. School Campus and facilities

Leicester Grammar School Trust schools are easily accessible from the nearby city of Leicester, the market town of Market Harborough, and beautiful East Midland villages such as Great Glen. Although situated in the scenic countryside, we are an easy 30-minutes drive from the M1 and from nearby rail stations, London St Pancras can be reached in around one hour.

The school operates a comprehensive bus service which enables a large number of pupils to travel to and from school each day.

The campus has extensive facilities; well-equipped specialist classrooms, library, science laboratories, music rooms, and both indoor and outdoor sports facilities. We have an on-site café for use by staff and sixth form pupils as well as a bespoke study area for sixth form.

Safeguarding

This role involves engaging in regulated activity relevant to children, it is an offence to apply for the role if you are barred from engaging in regulated activity relevant to children.

This role is exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 and the Trust is therefore permitted to ask you to declare all convictions and cautions (including those which would normally be considered "spent") in order to assess your suitability to work with children.

If you are successful in being shortlisted for this role, you will be required to provide information about your suitability to work with children by completing a self declaration form. In this form you will be required to provide details of all spent and unspent convictions and cautions. However, you will not have to disclose a caution or conviction for an offence committed in the United Kingdom if it has been filtered in accordance with the DBS filtering rules.
